IN THE MATTER OF THE CLEAN ENERGY PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION OF COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL (C&I) PROGRAM ENERGY EFFICIENCY INCENTIVES EXCEEDING \$300,000

BY THE BOARD:

The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities' (the "Board") SMARTSTART Buildings Program ("SSBP" or "SMARTSTART"), Direct Install Program and Pay-for-Performance Program offer financial incentives to New Jersey property owners to encourage the installation of energy efficient products and technologies. Eligible applicants may receive incentives for a portion of the cost of installing energy efficient technologies such as lighting, HVAC, water heating or other measures in new or existing buildings.

Educational Testing Services, Princeton, NJ, has submitted an application for a monetary incentive in the amount of \$1,057,833 under the Pay-for-Performance program, for a project located at 225 Phillips Blvd., Ewing, NJ. This rebate application, Docket Number EO11020085V, has a 26% energy savings above the base line, and is receiving an incentive of \$30,380 for the energy reduction plan (ERP); \$610,285 for certain measures (including elimination of steam plant, installation of new electric chiller, new hot water boilers, new cooling tower, and variable frequency drives (VFDs); upgrade AHU-10 supply & return fans to VFDs; installation of demand control ventilation and critical zone reset; and retrofit of chilled water flow control valves with pressure independent characterized control valves); and an estimated \$417,168 for the one year true up of its ERP.

TRC, the Market Manager engaged by the Board to manage the New Jersey Clean Energy Program C&I energy efficiency programs, has submitted a certification that the incentives for which TRC now seeks approval to commit have been calculated in accordance with the program policies and procedures, and that the listed amounts are the true and accurate estimated incentives for which each applicant is eligible. Further, Applied Energy Group, in its role as the NJCEP Program Coordinator, has reviewed the application and submitted a certification that the incentives for which TRC now seeks approval to commit have been calculated in accordance with the program policies and procedures, and that the listed amounts

are the true and accurate estimated incentives for which each applicant is eligible. Based on the above, the Staff recommends that the Board approve the above referenced application.

The Board **HEREBY APPROVES** the aforementioned application for the incentive amounts requested and AUTHORIZES issuance of a standard commitment letter to the applicant identified above, setting forth the terms and conditions of these commitments.
