BY THE BOARD:

This Order memorializes action taken by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board" or "BPU") at its March 23, 2022 public meeting, where the Board considered the budget modification to the Fiscal Year 2022 budget ("FY22 Budget") for the "Division of Clean Energy Program: Clean Energy Evaluation and Market Assessment," which is a contract with Rutgers University's Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy: Center for Green Building ("RCGB").

# **BACKGROUND & PROCEDURAL HISTORY**

On May 23, 2018, Governor Murphy signed into law the Clean Energy Act of 2018 ("CEA").<sup>1</sup> The CEA plays a key role in achieving the State's goal of 100% clean energy by 2050 by establishing aggressive energy reduction requirements, among other clean energy strategies. The CEA emphasizes the importance of energy efficiency ("EE") and peak demand reduction ("PDR"). The CEA also requires the Board to adopt an EE program "to ensure investment in cost-effective energy efficiency measures, ensure universal access to energy efficiency measures, and serve the needs of low-income communities."<sup>2</sup> EE is also one of the seven (7) key strategies identified in New Jersey's 2019 Energy Master Plan ("EMP") and will play an essential role in meeting the State's long-term clean energy goals, including by strengthening building and energy codes and appliance standards, along with other key strategies and goals, such as reducing energy consumption and emissions from the building sector.<sup>3</sup>

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On June 10, 2020, the Board approved an EE transition framework for implementation of EE and PDR programs in New Jersey, including requirements for the electric and natural gas public utilities ("Utilities") to establish programs that reduce the use of electricity and natural gas within their respective territories.<sup>4</sup> As part of this framework, the Board allocated administration of EE and PDR programs between the Utilities and the State.<sup>5</sup> The Board also established overall annual Utility territory-specific energy use reduction targets and State targets, with State targets in each Utility territory representing the energy use reductions that programs administered or sponsored by the State are to achieve.<sup>6</sup>

On September 22, 2017, the Board authorized the President to execute a Contract for Research and Evaluation Services, dated December 8, 2017, between the Board and RCGB ("Contract") for services RCGB was to perform during the period November 1, 2017 through October 31, 2018 ("Services") with a budget of \$580,000. This Contract provides staffing, expertise, and resources necessary to perform programmatic evaluations and cost-benefit analysis of New Jersey's Clean Energy Program ("NJCEP") to ensure effective design and provides Board Staff ("Staff") with technical assistance on a range of EE and renewable energy ("RE") issues. The original Contract term has been extended through various Contract amendments.

Most recently, on December 17, 2021, the Board approved the seventh amendment to the Contract ("Amendment #7"), which was a no-cost contract extension to extend Contract Year 4's end date from December 31, 2021 to June 30, 2022 so as to align with the end of the State's current Fiscal Year 2022 ("FY22").

Given the Contract extension granted in Amendment #7, and given continued adjustments to Services performed in support of the EM&V WG, as set forth in a letter from RCGB, dated February 22, 2022 (<u>Attachment 1</u>), this proposed modification to Amendment #7 ("FY22 Budget Modification" or "Amendment #8") entails a budget modification in the form of funds shifting across budget categories. The total budget for Contract Year 4 remains unchanged.

The change in Services under the FY22 Budget Modification will provide necessary support to the Board with respect to the Board's conducting needed market assessments and evaluation. This modification specifically includes RCGB's Energy Efficiency Partnership Agreement with Northeast Energy Efficiency Partnerships ("NEEP"), which includes analysis of Public Policy Leadership and Best Practices, Building Energy Codes and Appliance Standards, Community Pathways and Resources, Heating Electrification Market Transformation, and Smart Energy Homes and Buildings. The FY22 Budget Modification further supports expanded work scopes with existing subcontractors DNV and NMR Group, Inc., a Residential Appliance Saturation Study, completion of the Solar Market Potential and Building Benchmarking studies by RCGB, and purchases of needed supplies (industry data and reports) and software licenses.
