BY THE BOARD:

On May 15, 2023, Middlesex Water Company, Inc. ("Middlesex" or "Company"), a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey, filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board" or "BPU") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 *et seq.*, for authorization to implement a Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC") ("Petition"). Specifically, the Company requested that the Board approve the Company's DSIC Foundational Filing ("Foundational Filing") pursuant to 14:9-10.4(b) to recover costs associated with DSIC-eligible projects.

BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Company provides water service to approximately 61,000 retail customers in the Townships of Edison and Woodbridge, the Boroughs of South Plainfield, Metuchen and Carteret, and the City of South Amboy in Middlesex County, New Jersey, and the Township of Clark in Union County. The Company additionally serves part of the Township of Edison, the Boroughs of Highland Park and Sayreville, the Old Bridge Municipal Utilities Authority, the Marlboro Township Municipal Utilities Authority, and the City of Rahway. The Company also provides, under a special contractual basis, water treatment and pumping services to the Township of East Brunswick.

PETITION

By the Petition, the Company explained that it concluded its most recent base rate proceeding and implemented base rates pursuant to Board Order dated December 15, 2021, as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(c).¹ The Company further indicated its overall annual revenue level was established in the December 2021 Order.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(1), Middlesex submitted an engineering evaluation report ("DSIC Report") that identified the rationale for the DSIC-eligible work to be performed; demonstrated that the proposed plan is cost-effective; identified elements of the distribution system requiring investment, including assets which are susceptible to failure; and identified efforts to extend the life of distribution system assets.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(3) Middlesex additionally submitted its calculation of its base infrastructure spending, totaling approximately \$6,160,600. The Company determined its base infrastructure spending using authorized depreciation rates and depreciation expense balances for utility plant accounts 343, 345, and 348 as reported in its 2022 BPU Annual Report.

Further pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(3), the Company submitted its proposed DSIC rate schedule showing: i) the maximum dollar amount of the proposed DSIC rate assessment by customer class and meter size (or service connection) over the entire DSIC period; and ii) estimated maximum rate impact on customers for the entire DSIC period. The Company explained that the maximum amount of DSIC revenues it may be authorized to recover is capped at five percent (5%) of its total revenues established in its calculation of its total revenues established in its recently concluded base rate proceeding, or approximately \$5,055,502.²

Following issuance of notice in newspapers of general circulation within the Company's service territory and after service of notice upon affected municipalities and counties within Middlesex's service territory, two (2) virtual public hearings were held on September 7, 2023 at 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.; and were presided over by a Board-appointed legal specialist. No members of the public participated in either hearing and the Board received no written comments on this matter.

STIPULATION

As a result of discovery and comprehensive settlement discussions, the Company, Board Staff ("Staff"), and the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") (collectively, "Parties") executed a Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") resolving all issues in this proceeding, which provides for the following:³

1. The Company concluded its most recent base rate proceeding and implemented new base rates pursuant to Board Order dated December 15, 2021. As a part of its most recent

base rate case, the Company requested to reinstate its DSIC foundational filing. The Company withdrew its request to reinstate its DSIC during the pendency of the rate case. N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(c) precludes approval of a DSIC foundational filing where the utility has not had its base rates set by the Board within the past three years. Because the Company's last base rate case concluded on December 15, 2021, the Parties agree that the Company met the requirements of N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(c).

- 2. The Parties agree that the Company adequately submitted the DSIC Report pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(1), and its DSIC project information for the upcoming DSIC pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(2). The Parties further agree that the Company's expected base spending amount, including underlying detail regarding appropriate infrastructure types, a proposed DSIC assessment and work papers, demonstrated detailed calculations supporting the proposed assessment schedule pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(3). Further, the Parties agree that the Company gave appropriate public notice and properly held public hearings pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(4). The Parties agree that N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b)(5) and (6) are inapplicable at this time. Therefore, the Parties find the Petition to be administratively complete and further agree that the Company satisfied the requirements for its Foundational Filing as enumerated in N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b).
- 3. The Parties agree the projects contained in Exhibit B attached to the Stipulation have been reviewed and are DSIC-eligible projects as defined at N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.2, except projects classified in Exhibit B to the Stipulation as "Base Only" projects. "Base Only" projects may be used to satisfy the Company's Base Spending obligation but these projects are not DSIC-rate eligible. Furthermore, the Parties agree that none of the projects contained in Exhibit B of the Stipulation commenced during the Company's prior base rate case, denoting that only DSIC-eligible projects placed into service after the effective date of the Foundational Filing will be eligible for recovery under the Foundational Filing.
- 4. The Parties agree that the Company should be authorized to recover, through its DSIC, the actual costs associated with the DSIC-eligible projects, as defined in N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.2, contained in Exhibit B of the Stipulation.
- 5. The Parties agree that actual DSIC charges will be levied on General Metered Service customers billed in accordance with Rate Schedule No. 1 and Private Fire Service customers billed in accordance with Rate Schedule No. 2 and that the rate will be calculated in a manner consistent with N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.8(a)(3).
- 6. The Parties agree that the Company's base spending requirement is approximately \$6,160,561. The Parties further agree that the maximum amount of annual DSIC revenues the Petitioner may collected is approximately \$5,505,522, as calculated in Exhibit C of the Stipulation. The Parties further agree that the maximum DSIC surcharge cannot exceed the rates set forth in the Petition, for which notice was published and annexed hereto as Exhibit A of the Stipulation.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Having reviewed the record in this matter, including the Petition, the Foundational Filing and the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> the Stipulation to be reasonable, in the public interest, and in accordance with the law. Accordingly, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Stipulation, attached hereto, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if fully set forth at the length herein.

Based upon the information presented in the Foundational Filing and the record in the Company's most recent base rate case, and agreed to by the Parties in the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the Company's overall revenue for 2022 is \$110,110,446. As such, and in accordance with the five percent (5%) cap on DSIC recovery set forth in N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.2 and referenced in 14:9-10.9(a), the Board <u>FURTHER FINDS</u> that the maximum amount of annual DSIC revenues that the Company may collect is \$5,505,522.

The Company shall implement the DSIC surcharge if, and when, it achieves its specified levels of infrastructure investment and completes and places the facilities into service as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 *et seq.* As a result of this DSIC, an average residential customer with a 5/8-inch meter may see a maximum monthly DSIC surcharge of \$3.23.⁴

As such, the Board <u>HEREBY ORDERS</u> that, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.5(b), the Company shall make DSIC filings on a semi-annual basis, commencing six (6) months after the effective date of this Order. The Company must submit its semi-annual DSIC filing within 15 days of the end of the DSIC recovery period to be reviewed by Staff and Rate Counsel. The Board <u>FURTHER ORDERS</u> that the Company may recover the interim surcharge associated with the DSIC-eligible projects closed during the DSIC recovery period and not objected to by Staff or Rate Counsel beginning 45 days after the end of the DSIC recovery period, subject to refund at the Board's discretion.

The Board <u>FURTHER</u> <u>ORDERS</u> that the Company must comply with the base spending requirements set forth in this Order. Failure to comply with the base spending requirements will result in a reduction and refund, where appropriate, of the DSIC surcharge. Thus, Company's DSIC surcharge is interim, subject to refund, and shall not exceed the annual maximum revenue requirement of \$5,505,522 set forth in this Order.

The Board <u>FURTHER ORDERS</u> that, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(e), if within three (3) years after the effective date of this Order, the Company has not filed a petition in accordance with the Board's rules for the setting of its base rates, all interim charges collected under the DSIC shall be deemed an over-recovery, and shall be credited to customers in accordance with the Board's rules.

Based upon the foregoing, the Board <u>HEREBY APPROVES</u> the Foundational Filing and <u>AUTHORIZES</u> the Company to implement its proposed DSIC, subject to this Order and the Company's ongoing compliance with the DSIC regulations, base spending requirements, and semi-annual true-up submissions.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The parties to this proceeding, Middlesex Water Company ("Company" or "Petitioner"), a New Jersey public utility subject to the jurisdiction of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") and with its principal offices located at 485C Route One South, Suite 400, Iselin, New Jersey 08830; the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"); and Board Staff ("Staff") (collectively, "Parties"), by this Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") resolve all issues in this matter.

BACKGROUND

On May 15, 2023, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 et seq., the Petitioner filed a petition ("Petition") with the Board containing its distribution system

improvement charge ("DSIC") foundational filing ("Foundational Filing") and seeking authority to implement the Company's DSIC. By the Petition, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(b), the Company requested Board approval of its DSIC, which is currently set at zero (0), to recover costs associated with DSIC-eligible projects through an approved DSIC rate.¹

By the Petition, the Company noted that it is a duly organized and existing public utility of the State of New Jersey serving approximately 61,000 retail water customers primarily located in Middlesex County, New Jersey.

The Company noted that it calculated its base infrastructure spending requirement to be approximately \$6,160,600 and proposed its DSIC rate assessment schedule. The Company's allowable DSIC rate is capped at 5% of its total revenues established in its most recent rate base proceeding, or approximately \$5,055,502, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.9(a).

Following issuance of notice in newspapers of general circulation within the Company's service territory and after service of notice upon affected municipalities and counties within the Petitioner's service territory, the Board held two virtual public hearings, presided over by a Board-appointed legal specialist, at 4:30 pm and 5:30 pm on September 7, 2023. No members of the public participated in either hearing and no written comments were received. Copies of the public notices setting out the proposed rate impact of the DSIC are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

STIPULATION

Upon review of the Petition and following settlement discussions, the Parties HEREBY STIPULATE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Company concluded its most recent base rate proceeding and implemented new base rates pursuant to Board Order dated December 15, 2021.² As a part of its most recent base rate case, the Company requested to reinstate its DSIC foundational filing. The Company withdrew its request to reinstate its DSIC during the pendency of the rate case. N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(c) precludes approval of a DSIC foundational filing where the utility has not had its base rates set by the Board within the past three years. Because the Company's last base rate case concluded on December 15, 2021, the Parties agree that the Company met the requirements of N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.4(c).

- 3. The Parties agree the projects contained in Exhibit B attached hereto have been sufficiently reviewed and are DSIC-eligible projects as defined at N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.2, except

projects classified in Exhibit B as "Base Only" projects. "Base Only" projects may be used to satisfy the Company's Base Spending obligation but are not DSIC-rate eligible. Furthermore, the Parties agree that no project contained in Exhibit B commenced during the Company's prior base rate case that was approved by a final order issued by the Board on December 15, 2021, denoting that only DSIC-eligible projects placed into service after the effective date of the Foundational Filing will be eligible for recovery under the Foundational Filing.

- 4. The Parties agree that the Company should be authorized to recover, through its DSIC, the actual costs associated with the DSIC-eligible projects, as defined in N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.2, contained in Exhibit B attached hereto.
- 5. The Parties agree that actual DSIC charges will be levied on General Metered Service customers billed in accordance with Rate Schedule No. 1 and Private Fire Service customers billed in accordance with Rate Schedule No. 2 and that the rates will be calculated in a manner consistent with N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.8(a)(3).
- 6. The Parties agree that the Company's base spending requirement is approximately \$6,160,561. The Parties further agree that the maximum amount of annual DSIC revenues the Petitioner may collect is \$5,505,522, as calculated in Exhibit C attached hereto. The Parties further agree that the maximum DSIC surcharge cannot exceed the rates set forth in the Petition, for which notice was published and annexed hereto as Exhibit A.
- 7. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, reflecting a mutual balancing of interests and containing interdependent provisions, therefore it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition as each term is vital to its whole. It is also the intent of the

Parties that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall be a binding resolution governing all issues in this matter, specified and agreed to herein.

- 8. The Parties specifically agree that, if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the Order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, any party hereto materially affected shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation. None of the Parties shall be prohibited from, or prejudiced in, arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and no other matter.
- 9. It is specifically understood and agreed that this Stipulation represents a negotiated agreement that has been made exclusively for the purpose of these proceedings. All rates are subject to audit by the Board.
- 10. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are parties to this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING MIDDLESEX WATER COMPANY

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on May 15, 2023, Middlesex Water Company ("Company") filed a petition ("Petition") with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board" or "BPU") pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 et seq., seeking approval of a Foundational Filing to implement a Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC"). A DSIC is a rate recovery mechanism to encourage and support accelerated rehabilitation and replacement of certain non-revenue-producing critical water distribution components. Such projects include main replacement and renewal and the renewal of valves, hydrants, and service connections. Its purpose is to enhance safety, reliability, water quality, systems flows and pressure, and/or conservation. A DSIC rate is interim, subject to refund, until the subsequent base rate case.

The Petition consists of a Foundational Filing that lists the projects the Company believes are eligible for recovery through the DISC surcharge for the period 2023 through 2026. Please note that the Company proposes to collect a maximum DSIC revenue requirement of no more than 5.0% of the utility's total water revenues established in the Company's most recent base rate case. The Company will implement the DSIC surcharge if, and when, it achieves specific levels of infrastructure investment and places the facilities into service as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 et seq.

The Company proposed that the DSIC surcharge be assessed as to the following services and classes of customers based on meter size or service connection: General Metered Service and Private Fire Protection Service. Pursuant to BPU regulations, public fire service charges are not affected by this surcharge. It is important to note that any surcharges on customer bills implemented due to the DSIC will be revised on a semi-annual basis. The maximum surcharges, shown in Table 1 below, are not intended or expected to be reached until the conclusion of both the Foundational Filing proceeding and subsequent semi-annual DSIC filings. The Company expects the rates to be assessed incrementally over a three-year period commensurate with the Company's actual DSIC program capital spending.

The maximum proposed DSIC rates allowable for recovery pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-10.1 et seq. are set forth in Table 1 below.
