
#### Annual Entries, Exits and Monthly Point in Time Children in Placement




### January 2016 IAIU Caseload Report by Region











Mobile Response Stabilization Services (MRSS) Dispatched




Rate of Children in Care Management by County (per 1,000 children)






Displaced Homemaker Program Clients Served






Residential Domestic Violence Programs:DorVictims' Average Length of Stay (days)Admit

Domestic Violence Services - Adults and Children Admitted to Residential and Non-Residential Services Total New Clients




### Top 5 Counties with Unmet Need for Non-Residential DV Services
