Completed Independent Living Assessments of Youth Ages 14-18 years






IAIU Caseload Report Statewide



IAIU Caseload Report by Region








Any of these youth may be receiving services. These definitions are currently being reviewed to better understand how we capture DCPS work with his population. The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting. 2) Youth that achieved permanency.











Sexual Assault, Abuse and Rape Care Programs (SAARC)

Residential Domestic Violence Programs: Victims' Average Length of Stay (days)



Top 5 Counties with Residential DV Shelters Over Capacity


Women and Children Not Admitted to Domestic Violence Shelters Due to Insufficient Space
