STIPULATION OF SETTLEMENT  
AS TO COURTNEY CUFF ONLY  
BFD NO. 07-20091-03

The claim in this action having been settled and resolved by the parties, Plaintiff, Kenneth E. Kobylowski, Commissioner of the State of New Jersey Department of Banking & Insurance, and Defendant Pro Se, Courtney Cuff:

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND ACKNOWLEDGED by the parties that shortly after having been served with the complaint in this matter, defendant Courtney Cuff contacted plaintiff Commissioner's attorney, Deputy Attorney General William B. Puskas, Jr., to discuss settlement of this matter; and

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND ACKNOWLEDGED by the parties that settlement negotiations have proceeded on a regular basis between Cuff and plaintiff's counsel, but final resolution of this matter has been delayed due to vagaries in Cuff's employment, precluding him from paying an amount acceptable to plaintiff as an initial payment as part of settlement, with the balance to be paid on an installment basis; and

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND ACKNOWLEDGED by the parties that due to the ongoing negotiations, plaintiff's counsel refrained from a filing a default against Cuff, pursuant to R. 4:43-1; and

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND ACKNOWLEDGED by the parties that, on May 30, 2014, this matter was administratively dismissed without prejudice pursuant to R. 4:43-2 for lack of prosecution; and

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND AGREED by the parties that that it their mutual intent and desire to settle this matter and avoid further litigation; and

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND AGREED that this Stipulation of Settlement may be used against Cuff in any civil or administrative proceeding related to a violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 et seq., including a professional license suspension or revocation proceeding;

IT IS FURTHER STIPULATED AND AGREED that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-10(c), a copy of this Stipulation of Settlement shall be provided to any appropriate professional licensing authority; and


