THIS MATTER HAVING BEEN opened to the Court on the application of Matthew J. Platkin, Acting Attorney General of New Jersey, (by Chandra M. Arkema, Deputy Attorney General, appearing), attorney for Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance on a motion for final judgment by default; and

Defendant, Jane Haskins ("Defendant"), having been duly served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the above-captioned action, and default having been entered for Defendant's failure to appear, answer, or otherwise, defend;


This Court now finds that Defendant violated the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 ("Fraud Act") by misrepresenting that she was the only driver of a 2005 Suzuki Aerio car, and failing to disclose Ronald Pough as the regular driver of the Suzuki on her insurance application, Defendant (a) concealed or knowingly failed to disclose the occurrence of an event which affected her initial or continued right or entitlement to any insurance benefit or the amount of any benefit to which she was entitled, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(3); and (b) made written and oral statements intended to be presented to an insurance company for the purpose of obtaining an insurance policy, knowing that the statement contained false or misleading information concerning material facts, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(4)(b); and

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this 6 day of Oct 2022, entered in the amount of \$8,194.00 against Defendant, and in favor of Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance as follows:

1. \$5,000.00 in civil penalties against Defendant, for the Fraud Act violations alleged in Count 1 of the Complaint, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b);
2. A \$1,000 Fraud Act surcharge against Defendant, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1;
3. Attorneys' fees in the amount of \$2,194.00 against Defendant, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b);
