This matter, having been opened by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance (“Commissioner”), State of New Jersey, upon information that Samantha Jill Lompado (“Respondent”) currently licensed as a resident individual insurance producer, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-32a, may have violated various provisions of the insurance laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Respondent is subject to the provisions of the New Jersey Insurance Producer Licensing Act of 2001, N.J.S.A. 17:22A-26 to -48 (the “Producer Act”), the regulations governing the Insurance Producer Standards of Conduct, N.J.A.C. 11:17A-1.1 to N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.8 and the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 (“Fraud Act”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a, the Commissioner may place on probation, suspend, revoke or refuse to renew an insurance producer’s license, and may levy a civil penalty, for a violation of the Producer Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a (2), an insurance producer shall not violate any insurance law, regulation, subpoena or order of the Commissioner or of another state's insurance regulator; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a (8), an insurance producer shall not use fraudulent, coercive or dishonest practices, or demonstrate incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of insurance business in this State or elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17A-4.2, in cases where an applicant's signature is required, an insurance producer who takes an application for insurance shall be required to witness the signature of the prospective insured on the application prior to the submission of the application to the insurer only when the application is signed by the applicant after having been completed in a face to face meeting between the producer and the prospective insured. This requirement may be waived, however, upon prior written authorization by the insurer; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4a(4)(b), no person shall prepare or make any written or oral statement, intended to be presented to any insurance company or producer for the purpose of obtaining an insurance policy, knowing that the statement contains any false or misleading information concerning any fact or thing material to an insurance application or contract; and

WHEREAS, on December 19, 2019 Respondent did knowingly provide false and misleading information to Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company on two Whole Life applications by attesting that Respondent witnessed the signature of the parent, K.P., of the insured minor children, A.P. and S.P.; and

WHEREAS, the Respondent:

- 1) Has admitted responsibility for the aforementioned violations;
- 2) Has cooperated with the investigation conducted by the Department;

3) Has asserted that the violations cited in this Consent Order were not willful; and

WHEREAS, cause does exist under N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a, N.J.S.A. 17:22A-45c and N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5 to impose a fine; and

WHEREAS, the Respondent has waived her right to a hearing on the aforementioned violations and consented to payment of a fine in the amount of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) for violations of the Producer Act and payment of a fine in the amount of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for violations of the Fraud Act; and

WHEREAS, this matter should be resolved upon the consent of the parties without resort to a formal hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS on this 28 day of May, 2021

ORDERED AND AGREED, that the Respondent shall pay a fine in the amount of \$10,500.00 to the Department; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED, that said fine shall be paid by certified check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the "State of New Jersey, General Treasury," which shall be paid upon execution of this Consent Order by the Respondent; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED, that the signed Consent Order, together with the fine payment of \$10,500.00 shall be remitted to

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED, that Respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in the conduct that gave rise to this Consent Order.
