RESOLUTION

Regarding County Alliance Plans for Fiscal Year 2016

WHEREAS, the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (GCADA), the Alliance to Prevent Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Program and the Drug Enforcement Demand Reduction Fund (DEDR) were established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:2C:35-15; and,

WHEREAS, the GCADA has the statutory authority to adopt regulatory rules and policies for the administration and governance of the Alliance to Prevent Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Program; and,

WHEREAS, the GCADA also has the statutory authority to adopt a funding formula in order to disperse funds to said Program from the DEDR fund; and,

WHEREAS, the GCADA in accordance with the GCADA's adopted rules, it has received the County Alliance Plans for Fiscal Year 2016 from:

WHEREAS, the Strategic Plan Review Committee and staff have reviewed the aforementioned County applications and recommend their consideration by the full Council.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the GCADA approves the following Fiscal Year 2016 County Alliance Grant Awards subject to executing a Letter of Agreement, Grant Agreement and Attachments A, B and C that shall detail County compliance with reporting, monitoring, evaluation and auditing procedures to ensure that only allowable expenditures are funded and which may be amended during the term of the Award:
