## Proclamation

WHEREAS, since 1987, the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence, Inc. (NCADD) has designated the month of April as "Alcohol Awareness Month;" and

WHEREAS, for this year's observance, NCADD has chosen the theme, "Help for Today, Hope for Tomorrow," to draw attention to the pervasive impact that alcohol, alcoholism and alcohol-related problems have on young people, their friends, families and communities - and to highlight the reality that help is available and recovery is possible; and

WHEREAS, alcohol is the number one drug of choice for America's youth, surpassing tobacco and illicit drugs; and

WHEREAS, those who begin consuming alcohol before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcoholism than those who begin at age 21; and

WHEREAS, alcoholism is a chronic, progressive disease that is genetically predisposed but is nevertheless a treatable condition from which people can and do recover; and

WHEREAS, NCADD's New Jersey affiliate and the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse are committed to developing initiatives that educate New Jersey's young people about the dangers of alcohol and drug abuse while assisting those who are already struggling with substance addiction; and

WHEREAS, the month of April offers numerous opportunities for parents, schools and colleges, community leaders, healthcare providers, employers and young people to cooperate on efforts to control alcohol abuse among underage residents and promote healthy recreational alternatives to drinking;

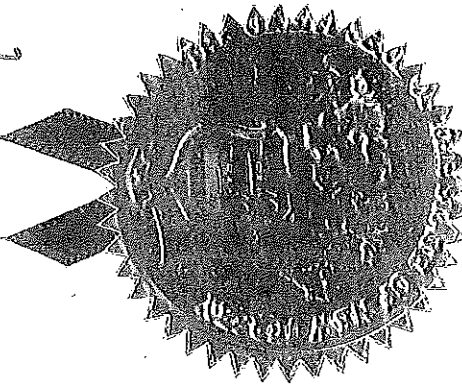
NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHRIS CHRISTIE, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:
